6) ACTIONS ALLOWING AN INCLUSIVE APPROACH

To help communication during the Sâo Paolo training courses all basic training modules were delivered in Portuguese. And simultaneous translation was provided for advanced modules delivered in English. Simultaneous translation (payed for by CIDOC) was provided from the collaborative session at the Museu da Republica during the Rio conference.

CIDOC continues to maintain its website in several languages. These included the 3 primary ICOM languages as well as some additional languages.

Messages sent to the CIDOC membership are translated whenever possible into the three main ICOM languages.

The CIDOC newsletter is published in both English and French. We are evaluating the feasibility of offering a Spanish version.

7) SYNTHESIS OF ACTIVITIES AND RESULTS OBTAINED

This year's annual CIDOC conference took place Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, during the ICOM triennial conference, August 10-17. Around 70 delegates attended the CIDOC events. CIDOC adopted a new approach to the ICOM triennial conference – concentrating on networking and cooperation with other International Committees, building on the good relations we have with our colleagues in related fields and hoping to establish new alliances. We contributed to two days of joint events – one in conjunction with ICMS and COSTUME, at the Museum of the Republic in the centre of Rio, the other with ICOFOM and ICTOP. We also maintained an information "booth" during the Rio conference so that potential members could find out more about what we do. During the run up to the conference we organised a full week of training workshops in São Paolo, which was generously supported by the state of São Paolo and the Pinacoteca. The event was very well attended and will be repeated in 2014.

BUILDING ON THE SUCCESS OF THE 2011 AND 2012 SESSIONS, CIDOC ORGANIZED A THIRD U.S.A. SUMMER SCHOOL IN 2013, FOCUSING ON THE PRINCIPLES AND PRACTICE OF MUSEUM DOCUMENTATION. THE PROGRAMME IS ORGANISED IN COLLABORATION WITH THE MUSEUM OF TEXAS TECH UNIVERSITY (MOTTU) AND REGULARLY WELCOMES UNESCO FUNDED PARTICIPANTS.

THE STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLES OF MUSEUM DOCUMENTATION, PRODUCED BY THE DOCUMENTATION STANDARDS WORKING GROUP WAS RATIFIED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY IN 2013 AND IS NOW ADOPTED AS OFFICIAL ICOM POLICY.

A KEY CIDOC REFERENCE DOCUMENT, THE INTERNATIONAL GUIDELINES FOR MUSEUM OBJECT INFORMATION: THE CIDOC INFORMATION CATEGORIES, IS AT LAST AVAILABLE IN FRENCH, AS RECOMMANDATIONS INTERNATIONALES POUR LA DOCUMENTATION DES OBJETS MUSÉAUX. OFTEN CITED IN SCIENTIFIC WRITING AND A FUNDAMENTAL TEXTS USED IN MUSEOLOGY COURSES THROUGHOUT THE WORLD, THE GUIDELINES WERE ALSO USED AS THE BASIS FOR THE CIDOC CONCEPTUAL REFERENCE MODEL. SPANISH AND PORTUGUESE VERSIONS ARE IN PREPARATION.

CIDOC MEMBERSHIP INCREASED IN 2013 TO JUST OVER 500. WE HOPE TO BUILD ON THIS SUCCESS AND CONTINUE TO ATTRACT NEW MEMBERS.

PROFILE OF THE TRAINERS	The São Paolo training programme will be delivered primarily in Portuguese by experienced local trainers who have completed CIDOC Teacher Training. Advanced modules will be delivered in English (with simultaneous translation) by CIDOC trainers: board members and chairs of WGs.

4) PLANNED RESEARCH ACTIVITIES

A collaborative project on the terminology of museology, inspired by the *Dictionarium Museologicum*, published by CIDOC in 1986, is taking shape as an online resource to which experts in the field may contribute – ensuring that the catalogue of terms and concepts used by the museum profession can be updated to reflect current usage.

Dr Manvi Seth (head of the Dept. of Museology, National Museum, New Delhi) has agreed to chair a new working group on the documentation of intangible heritage. Details will be published on the CIDOC website.

CIDOC is developing a check list to allow easy evaluation of good practice in museum documentation. A trial version was successfully tested during the 2013 Rio conference. We intend to refine and add to the document and to develop an online version.

5) PLANNED ACTIONS ALLOWING AN INCLUSIVE APPROACH

CIDOC WILL BE MANAGING A BURSARY SCHEME TO ASSIST PARTICIPANTS FROM DEVELOPING COUNTRIES IN ATTENDING THE 2014 CONFERENCE. FUNDS ARE PROVIDED PRIMARILY BY THE GETTY FOUNDATION, AND SOME ADDITIONAL FUNDS ARE PROVIDED BY CIDOC.

CIDOC BOARD MEETINGS ARE HELD ONLINE TO FACILITATE THE PARTICIPATION OF BOARD MEMBERS OUTSIDE EUROPE. IN ADDITION WE PROVIDE FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO ALLOW BOARD MEMBERS TO ATTEND MEETINGS IN PERSON WHEN NEEDED.

6) OTHER PLANNED ACTIVITIES

We will continue our efforts to find ways of improving the quality of our membership lists, as well as contacting and enrolling new CIDOC members.

We intend to review and update, where needed, existing CIDOC recommendations and standards. Documents that were originally published in paper form will be digitized and made available as electronic documents. Key documents that are still of relevance will be translated into the three main ICOM languages.

Papers from the 2014 conference will be made available through the CIDOC digital library.
